# Sun Catcher



# Here comes the sun!

Bask in the colorful light created when the sunshine meets this pony bead sun catcher.

# Supplies:

- Approximately thirty (30) plastic pony beads
- Sandpaper
- Aluminum foil
- Muffin pan
- Scissors
- Outdoor stove/grill
- Electric drill (optional)
- Fishing line (optional)



### Instructions:

- 1. Mold aluminum foil around the bottom of one (1) muffin well on a muffin pan (Fig. 1).
- 2. Using scissors and the mold from step one (1), cut out a circle of aluminum foil that will fit into the bottom of one (1) muffin well in a muffin pan (Fig. 2).
- 3. Fold the aluminum foil circle into quarters. Cut designs into the quartered circle, a la a paper snowflake (Fig. 3). Carefully unfold the aluminum and place at the bottom of one muffin well.
- 4. Fill one (1) muffin well with a single layer of pony beads (Fig. 4).
- 5. Warm the muffin tin using an outdoor stove or grill (Fig. 5). Use an indoor stove at your own risk; melting plastic fumes are acrid and poisonous.
- 6. Melt until the sun catchers do not appear "pebbly", about ten minutes on a gas grill with the cover closed. Let cool.
- 7. Once cool, invert the muffin pan and the sun catcher should fall right out. Use a butter knife to loosen the sides, if necessary.
- 8. Sand down jagged edges, if necessary (Fig. 6).
- 9. If desired, use an electric drill to make a small hole near the outer edge of the sun catcher. Thread fishing line through the hole and tie with a knot.
